Enrolment will be performed online only, having connected to VMU Students' Self-service Portal at: <https://studentas.vdu.lt>

A username is: name.surname (lowercase, Latin alphabet letters only) and a password.

THE STAGES OF ENROLMENT:

STAGE I - main enrolment into study subjects, seminars, and laboratory works;

STAGE II - final revision of enrolled subjects, crossing out of undesirable subjects and enrolling into the vacancies of study subjects, seminars and laboratory works.

The following criteria are applied in both stages of enrolment:

1. **Higher year of studies** (priority is given to senior students);
2. **Average of penultimate semester (2023 autumn) marks** (priority is given to students who have a higher average; for first-year students – higher competitive score).

Over the course of enrolment, students must check:

- If their name is included in the subject of their priorities;
- If other students with higher marks “have not pushed you out” of the subject.

In the second stage, a student with higher priority shall not replace a student with lower priority who enrolled in the first stage; it is noteworthy that should a student remove himself/herself from a study subject, he/she will not get the same place should he/she want to re-enrol.

A student must follow his/her enrolment on every subject list in the course of all stages. If he/she finds his/her name below the line of students enrolled in the subject (“**NOT LISTED**”), it is possible that in due course a student will get onto the list (“**LISTED**”).

After stage I of enrolment is over, Group A subjects and elective study field subjects (Group C) with a small number of enrolled students might be removed from the list of subjects offered that semester. Please follow the announcements after this stage of enrolment.

Important information:

1. Students and free-movers enrolled into study courses that include seminars and/or laboratory work **must register for them separately** by choosing a particular group. The cumulative volume of the course in credits (the lecture + laboratory works; seminars) can be seen next to the lecture.
2. Enrolment in foreign language courses:
 - first-, second- and third-year students of bachelor and integrated study programmes who begin studying English at a higher level than A1 must acquire level C1 of academic English.
 - students of bachelor and integrated study programmes who start studying English at level A1 must acquire level B2 of academic English.
 - a student must choose not less than 12 credits from the subgroup of foreign languages during the first four semesters of study;
 - the university offers free and paid language courses; the list of free languages is approved by the Rector's order;
 - should a student enrol in paid or free language courses, she/he has to present a confirmed electronic statement of his/her ECTS credits used for languages. Faculty administrators confirm whether a student still has ECTS credits for language studies or has to pay (2 BSP for 6 ECTS) for the chosen course. First-year students of bachelor and integrated study programmes do not have to present the electronic statement for English courses in the autumn semester;
 - the students who enrol in a paid language course but do not pay the course fee or do not present the electronic statement confirming their free credits for language studies shall be removed from the language course after the first month of the semester and shall pay the fee for this time period;
 - international students have a priority for language courses taught via English. Lithuanian-speaking learners can only register to these courses if the group is not full.
3. Before enrolling into subjects, each student, while compiling his/her individual study plan, shall have to choose subjects the volume of which is:
 - For full-time student - **not less than 24 and not more than 36 credits per semester**. The recommended total volume of one year full-time studies is **60 credits**. For students who study in minor or individual studies, the volume of semester study credits should not exceed **42 credits**.
 - For part-time student - **not less than 14 and not more than 26 credits per semester**. The recommended total volume of one year part-time studies is **45 credits**.
